Certification Terms Quick Reference

What do the various certifications such as UL, CE and CSA mean and which countries require them?

CE: Abbreviation of the French phrase Conformité Européene, which literally means European Conformity

- European regulatory agency that writes standards in which electrical equipment is tested for safety and electromagnetic compatibility.
- A harmonized set of test standards was written by the European Community to remove barriers to trade caused by inconsistent testing requirements.
- CE requires testing to be done by third-party test houses.
- All BP products that are electrical must have the CE mark to be sold into Europe.

FCC: Abbreviation for Federal Communications Commission

- US regulatory agency that writes standards that establish the allowable limits of electromagnetic emissions from electronic equipment.
- Write standards by which electrical equipment is tested for safety and electromagnetic compatibility.
- FCC requires testing to be done by third-party test houses.

UL: Abbreviation for Underwriters Laboratories

- US regulatory agency that writes standards in which electrical equipment is tested for safety and electromagnetic compatibility.
- Tests equipment for compliance with established standards.

CSA: Abbreviation for Canadian Standards Association

- Canadian equivalent of UL
- Canadian regulatory agency that writes standards in which electrical equipment is tested for safety and electromagnetic compatibility.
- Tests equipment for compliance with established standards.

CUL: Mark UL issues when product is compliant with UL and CSA standards

- UL and CSA entered into an agreement several years ago that allows them to test to each others standards.
- Each of the agencies has specific marks (logos) to indicate compliance to the specific standard; for example UL authorizes the manufacturer to apply the UL mark after compliance to the UL standard is verified.
